Session Descriptions/Learning Objectives

General Session 1: Enhancing Enhanced Recovery: Transitioning from 23 Hour Stay to Same Day Discharge

After participating in this activity, the learner will be able to: 1) Understand the key differences in the concept of enhanced recovery after inpatient and outpatient surgical procedures; 2) Discuss the key elements that would enhance functional recovery after ambulatory surgery; 3) Recognize the potential impact of patient selection on perioperative outcome; 4) Explain evidence-based strategies in achieving rapid recovery after specific procedures that are increasingly performed in an ambulatory setting; 5) Develop clinical pathways based on the updated best practices approach.

General Session 2: Advances in Airway Management in the ASC and NORA

This session will list airway management strategies for GI endoscopy, compare different ventilation management technologies and describe the utility of the Thrive non-ETT oxygenation and ventilation technique for ambulatory ENT and NORA procedures, and the use of Thrive in difficult airway situations. Strategies to avoid some common, minor but annoying, complications associated with the use of SGAs, ETTs and other airway adjuncts will be covered.

General Session 3: ASC Practice Management: Not as Easy as it Sounds

At the end of the presentation, participants should be able to use practice management principles to improve the efficiency of an ASC, while maintaining patient safety; identify new education opportunities that address gaps that will improve your career as an ASC Medical Director; understand Value Based Purchasing and improve patient satisfaction scores; and prepare for an active shooter emergency.

General Session 4: Practicing Beyond the SAMBA Guidelines

In 2010 SAMBA published the first of several consensus statements on ambulatory anesthesia considerations for patients with certain medical conditions. Three common maladies that challenge ambulatory anesthesiologists: diabetes, obesity and obstructive sleep apnea (OSA) will be covered in this panel. This panel will discuss those original statements and new information in terms of therapies, medications, guidelines since their publication. The panelists will also highlight the issues still unresolved for patients with those conditions undergoing procedures in different ambulatory settings.

General Session 5: Opioid Problems in Your Own Backyard

Attendees will learn opioid minimizing techniques across the ambulatory surgery continuum. Methods to minimize opioid prescribing practices as well as developing community educational programs will be explored.

General Session 6: Accreditation Panel

During this session the attendee will learn about the economic pressures being placed on providers to make healthcare more affordable while maintaining quality and safety, the impact that regulatory bodies have on daily practice and their importance and the use of true outcomes measures for both improving care and driving reimbursement.

General Session 7: Cases from the Real World

During this session, attendees will examine actual case scenarios and integrate various methods of care and strategies for preclinical problem solving for ambulatory surgical patients into their daily practice.

General Session 8: They Are Not Just Little Adults

Following this session, attendees will be able to assess and manage pediatric tonsillectomy patients with sleep disordered breathing, judge how obesity in the pediatric patient has different implications for different cases, summarize common pediatric controversies and their relevant facts.

General Session 9: Regional Anesthesia: Common Blocks, Common Problems

After participating in this session, the learners will be able to choose reasonable investigations and treatments as necessary, identify reasonable timelines for recovery. Participants will also be able to list those nerve blocks that are most useful in the ambulatory setting, discuss the significant advantages of these regional anesthetic techniques and describe the clinical pearls and potential pitfalls involved with their use.

OBA Symposium

For anesthesiologists opening and operating an office-based practice, there are numerous considerations for managing and operating the practice. Attendees will learn from colleagues in the trenches.

Consult the Experts

These small group sessions are specifically designed to provide an opportunity for open and detailed discussions of relevant ambulatory anesthesia and surgery topics. Expert speaker session formats may range from a relatively unstructured "open house", where attendees can stop by and ask specific questions to prepared introductory topic remarks followed by open discussion by the small group.

ASA Update

Attendees will gain an understanding of the American Society of Anesthesiologists' role in an educational, research and scientific association of physicians and delineate how practitioners can use its resources to enhance their patient care and professional activities.

Problem Based Learning Discussions (PBLD)

Attendees will discuss and critique the evaluation, management and implementation of patient care in specific ambulatory clinical scenarios.

Excellence and Innovation Presentations

Attendees will be able to describe focused ambulatory anesthesia knowledge gained through research as presented by scientific abstract awardees.


