Learning Objectives

General Session 1:

Review of Systems: Specific Disease States and Considerations

After attending this session, you will:

- Recognize the impact of cardiac disease on anesthesia care and recovery from ambulatory surgery and apply strategies that may alter outcome.
- Describe the risks of ambulatory surgery for patients with obesity and/or sleep apnea and employ certain actions to mitigate these risks.
- Identify the concerns for diabetes patients undergoing ambulatory surgery and implement practices to improve safety, perioperative glucose control and return to normal routines for these patients.
- Indicate potential issues with implantable devices and recognize the need for, and limitations on, interventions during ambulatory surgery.

General Session 2:

Regional Anesthesia

After attending this session, you will:

- Be able to describe the practical use of spinal anesthesia for ambulatory surgical procedures, as well as innovative regional anesthetic techniques for plastic surgical procedures.
- Discuss new data on clinical use of long acting local anesthetics and describe best practices of providing care for opioid dependent patients having ambulatory surgical procedures.
- Identify the evidence basis for regional anesthesia providing superior outcomes for patients having ambulatory surgical procedures.
- Be able to describe how to successfully initiate an ambulatory regional catheter service.

General Session 3:

“To Sleep Perchance to Die” – Sedation Economics, Politics, and Technology

After attending this session you will:

- Understand the detailed working of SEDASYS and review literature that supported its approval by FDA.
- Become aware of required ISAP training.
- Review the growth of sedation for certain service lines (e.g., endoscopy).
- Understand the greed and the proliferation of problematic payment models (e.g., “company model”).
- Review government pronouncements on different payment arrangements.
- Become aware of medical necessity issues.
- Understand the possible reevaluation of certain anesthesia codes used to bill for sedation.
- Review the definitions of sedation levels.
- Understand the ASA’s guidance for the DAS.
- Understand the regulatory framework in which sedation is provided (CMS Guidelines and state laws indicating who may administer sedation).

General Session 4:

Rapid Fire Topics – Pediatrics

This session offers fast paced summaries of three evolving issues in pediatric ambulatory anesthesia: non-operating room anesthesia and sedation, neurocognitive effects of anesthesia, and obstructive sleep apnea.

After attending this session you will:

- Recognize the common issues and most likely problems dealing with pediatric anesthesia and sedation for NORA (non-operating room anesthesia).
- Understand the current controversies surrounding the effects of anesthesia on neurocognitive development in pediatric patients.
- Describe the risks and risk factors of anesthesia for pediatric ambulatory surgery in patients with obstructive sleep apnea.

General Session 5:

Cases from the Real World

Attendees will examine actual case scenarios and integrate various methods of care and strategies for preclinical problem solving for ambulatory surgical patients into their daily practice.

General Session 6:

ASCA Panel

Current Legislative and Economic Changes Shaping the ASC Industry

Topics at this session will include the 2014 Final Quality Reporting Rule, changes to CMS ASC payment system, and updates on the proposal to repeal the Sustainable Growth Rate and establish a new formula for paying doctors and hospitals that treat Medicare patients.

After this session you will:

- Be able to identify current trends in legislative and economic changes which are affecting the ASC industry.

General Session 7:

ASDA Panel

For many patients with special needs, the only hope for receiving comprehensive quality care in a safe and efficient manner during procedures outside the operating room is through pharmacological intervention. This presentation will describe the special needs population, identify barriers to care and detail anesthetic intervention as an adjunct to treatment in an office-based setting.

After attending this session you will:

- Be able to identify barriers to dental care for patients with special needs and discuss useful anesthetic drugs for the special needs population.
- Prevent and control emergence delirium.
- Match patients and techniques according to procedure, patient type, and treatment setting.

General Session 8:

Managing the Practical Side of Practice Management

This panel will provide an opportunity to discuss some practical and proven methods of improving quality and reducing costs in the ambulatory surgery environment. The focus will be on the presenter's personal experience of opportunities for improvement and efficiency.

After attending this session you will:

- Know how to create an effective plan to reduce cancellations at your facility.
- Learn effective techniques to improve operational efficiency and appropriately manage capital acquisition.
- Be able to assess the work that should be accomplished by your business manager and consider additional ways in which that manager can improve quality at your facility.
- Be able to determine the best metrics and methods for using an incentive plan in your facility.

General Session 9:

Regulatory, Medical Malpractice, Politics

In this session, experts from the ASA's Washington D.C. office and Committee on Practice Management will discuss the latest regulatory, medico-legal, and political trends affecting ambulatory anesthesia and surgery in a rapidly evolving healthcare landscape.

After attending this session you will:

- Be able to identify the top regulatory concerns in ambulatory surgery and understand the regulatory effects of the Affordable Care Act on the ASC industry.
- Understand the medico-legal landscape in ambulatory anesthesia and be able to identify strategies to mitigate risk.
- Understand the political effects of the Affordable Care Act on the ambulatory surgery practice and the possible ramifications of any future changes.

General Session 10:

Journal Club Literature Review

Learning Objectives

Lecture Series—Airway Management: Focus on Obesity, Rescue Strategy, and New Development

This lecture series will be presented by experts on highly relevant areas and new development in airway management in the ambulatory patient.

After attending this session you will:

- Understand and apply new techniques to optimize oxygenation and airway management in the morbidly obese.
- Have a practical approach in rescue techniques in difficult mask ventilation, LMA, and intubation situations.
- Extract the main findings and apply recommendations from the 2013 ASA difficult airway guidelines.

These small group sessions are specifically designed to provide an opportunity for open and detailed discussions of relevant ambulatory anesthesia and surgery topics. Expert speaker session formats may range from a relatively unstructured “open house”, where attendees can stop by and ask specific questions to prepared introductory topic remarks followed by open discussion by the small group.

ASA Update

Attendees will gain an understanding of the American Society of Anesthesiologists’ role in an educational, research, and scientific association of physicians and delineate how practitioners can use its resources to enhance their patient care and professional activities.

Problem-Based Learning Discussion (PBLD)

Attendees will discuss and critique the evaluation, management and implementation of patient care in specific ambulatory clinical scenarios.

Excellence and Innovation

Attendees will be able to describe focused ambulatory anesthesia knowledge gained through research as presented by scientific abstract awardees.

Hands-On Workshop: Regional Ultrasound Techniques

Based on participant expertise, attendees will demonstrate both basic and advanced techniques for peripheral nerve blocks using ‘single shot’ techniques as well as regional catheters for ambulatory anesthetic management. Attendees will also describe common or serious complications of regional techniques and how to both manage and avoid them.




This American Board of Anesthesia (ABA) APPLIED EXAMINATION, formerly the ABA Part 2 (oral) examination, has long been known for the unique challenges it presents, both in its unique format as well as in the very special set of test-taking skills examinees will need to pass.

This session is aimed at residents and new resident-graduates who wish to develop the specific skill-set needed to pass the ABA Oral Board Exam. The session is designed to provide a realistic oral board exam experience, with participants functioning as “examinees” in at least two individual practice exam sessions, designed to be one-on-one with designated faculty. Our faculty examiners, many of whom are previous ABA oral board examiners, will administer a private 15-20 minute practice oral board exam followed by an individualized 5-10 minute feedback session focused not on fund-of-knowledge, but rather on the strategies necessary to navigate the exam rubric utilized by the ABA.

Clinical stems will be provided at the beginning of the session. Participants are not required to do any specific preparation. Lunch will be served.

Objectives:

- At the end of this session, participants will be familiar with the format and objectives of the ABA Applied (Oral) Examination.
- Participate in at least two practice oral board exam sessions.
- Grow in understanding of the qualities that define a successful exam performance.
- Develop strategies to improve exam performance.
