Learning Objectives

General Session 1

NORA and MAC Sedation: Safety, Monitoring & Delivery

This session will highlight current knowledge about the risks of sedation and NORA care with data from the ASA Closed Claim Database and other sources. We will review state-of-the-art thinking about monitoring for sedation and NORA, and will review medication choices for sedation.

At the conclusion of this session, you will be able to:

- Discuss what is known about the risks of sedation and NORA care.
- Describe state-of-the-art monitoring for sedation and NORA.
- Identify the advantages and disadvantages of choice of agent(s) for sedation and NORA.

General Session 2

23 Hour Stay/"Big" Outpatient

This session focuses on the non-traditional outpatient procedures, often requiring overnight observation and/or 23 hour stay.

At the conclusion of this session, you will be able to:

- Describe the unique anesthetic considerations for robotic surgery, especially as pertains to positioning and ventilation.
- Recognize the trend of increased ambulatory orthopedic procedures, including spinal surgery and total joint replacement for same day discharge. Anesthetic considerations for prompt recovery and discharge of these patients will be presented.
- Identify different types of surgery being accomplished utilizing a 23 hour stay practice.
- Discuss the medical and anesthetic issues surrounding the overnight observation practice.

General Session 3

Patient Selection for Ambulatory Surgery

Appropriate patient selection has been shown to correlate with perioperative outcome after ambulatory surgery. As complexity of patients and surgical procedures performed in ambulatory settings increase, it is necessary to determine appropriate patient selection. This lecture will discuss the current literature that allows appropriate patient selection, particularly in high risk patients, patients with difficult airways, morbid obesity, obstructive sleep apnea, and cardiac comorbidities, including patients with pacemakers and implantable cardioverter-defibrillators.

At the conclusion of this session, you will be able to:

- Summarize selection difficulties associated with patients suffering from morbid obesity, obstructive sleep apnea, cardiac comorbidities and difficulty airways.
- Strategize induction of anesthesia for high risk patients.

General Session 4

Post-operative/Recovery

Pain and nausea are two of the most common symptoms following anesthesia and surgical procedures. This session will discuss risk assessments of patients for PONV, guidelines for the prevention and management of PONV, and regional anesthetic techniques to provide optimal ambulatory pain control.

At the conclusion of this session, you will be able to:

- Summarize clinical guidelines for the prevention and management of PONV.
- Apply risk assessment methods to assess patient-related, surgery-related, and anesthesia-related factors in the determination of patient risk for PONV.
- Evaluate the efficacy of various therapeutic strategies for PONV prophylaxis, including combination and multimodal therapies.
- Apply innovative regional anesthetic techniques to treat persistent postoperative pain allowing rapid ambulatory discharge.
- Evaluate regional anesthetic techniques to provide optimal ambulatory pain control.

General Session 5

Rapid Fire

This session offers fast-paced summaries of three evolving issues in ambulatory anesthesia: malignant hyperthermia, OR fire prevention and local anesthetic toxicity rescue.

General Session 6

NORA – Site Specific Issues and Solutions

The field of minimally invasive procedures/surgery is advancing at a very fast pace, leading to new procedures, in older and higher risk patients that are being performed in non-operating room locations. Anesthesiologists are required to match that pace and provide these procedures with safe anesthetic care for them.

At the conclusion of this session, you will be able to:

- Perform anesthesia for the latest procedures.
- Determine the anesthetic considerations/management for these procedures in the non-operating room locations.

General Session 7

Cases from Your Real World

Attendees will examine actual case scenarios and integrate various methods of care and strategies for preclinical problem solving for ambulatory surgical patients into their daily practice.

General Session 8

ASCA Panel

Topics at this session will include the 2014 Final Quality Reporting Rule, changes to CMS ASC payment system, and updates on the proposal to repeal the Sustainable Growth Rate and establish a new formula for paying doctors and hospitals that treat Medicare patients.

At the conclusion of this session, you will be able to:

- Identify current trends in legislative and economic changes which are affecting the ASC industry.

General Session 9

Regulatory and Legislative Update

In this session, experts will discuss the latest regulatory, medico-legal, and political trends affecting ambulatory anesthesia and surgery in a rapidly evolving healthcare landscape.

At the conclusion of this session, you will be able to:

- Identify the major regulatory concerns in ambulatory surgery.
- Review the medico-legal landscape in ambulatory anesthesia and identify strategies to mitigate risk.

General Session 10

OBA

For anesthesiologists opening an office-based practice, there are numerous considerations for best designing and operating the practice.

At the conclusion of this session, you will be able to:

- Develop business strategies to successfully operate an office-based practice.

- Recognize and make changes, as needed, based on current credentialing trends and accreditation requirements for the safe provision of office-based anesthesia.
- Discuss airway management techniques and issues specific to the office practice.

These small group sessions are specifically designed to provide an opportunity for open and detailed discussions of relevant ambulatory anesthesia and surgery topics. Expert speaker session formats may range from a relatively unstructured “open house”, where attendees can stop by and ask specific questions to prepared introductory topic remarks followed by open discussion by the small group.

ASA Update

Attendees will gain an understanding of the American Society of Anesthesiologists’ role in an educational, research and scientific association of physicians and delineate how practitioners can use its resources to enhance their patient care and professional activities.

Problem Based Learning Discussions (PBLD)

Attendees will discuss and critique the evaluation, management and implementation of patient care in specific ambulatory clinical scenarios.

Excellence and Innovation Presentations

Attendees will be able to describe focused ambulatory anesthesia knowledge gained through research as presented by scientific abstract awardees.

Hands-On Workshop

Based on participant expertise, attendees will demonstrate both basic and advanced techniques for peripheral nerve blocks using ‘single shot’ techniques as well as regional catheters for ambulatory anesthetic management. Attendees will also describe common or serious complications of regional techniques and how to both manage and avoid them.


